The problem

The fragmentation of disciplines and societal domains creates...

- separated knowledge systems and sometimes incompatible rationales;
- ignorance and misunderstandings; and
- untapped innovation spaces of solution finding for complex environmental and societal problems.

- conveys concepts, methods and tools to create and manage enabling science-practice interfaces;
- 5. offers media training and writing exercises;
- 6. provides test fields for real stakeholder interactions.

CUT IN YOUR STAKEHOLDERS

Today, scientists need to tackle complex social and environmental issues. Sometimes this goes beyond the traditional boundaries of academia. Therefore it is important that science considers methodologies that help manage this interaction with society.

Rehearsal time

Scientist should be clear on how their research relates to society and what methods aid the collaboration process. Learning these new techniques fits very well with the intentions of the Winter School. Such training helps an individual researcher manage interactions with stakeholders.

A coach at the Winter School is Dr. Christian Erik Pohl. He is a lecturer of Participatory Research at the ETH in Zurich. A useful method taught by Dr. Pohl at the Winter School is "Stakeholder Constellation" (continued on next page).
